
## Social Determinants of Health

These circumstances are shaped by the distribution of money, power and resources at global, national and local levels."






## Social Determinants of Health







## Premature Mortality


Years of potential life lost before age 75 per 100,000 population (age-adjusted)






Figure 3: Maternal Mortality Rate by County-Level Family Poverty Rate, United States, 1969-2007












## Three's a crowd

## Number and Percentage of U.S. Population with Diagnosed Diabetes, 1958-2013














#### Diabetes hospital visits for Ambulatory Care Sensitive Conditions (emergency dept.)

County with Manchester and Nashua




### Percent of adults who eat fruits and vegetables 5 or more times per day; 2009, Coos County



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## **Oral Health & SDOH**


- Tooth decay causes pain, loss of teeth, problem with chewing and speaking
- Affects an individuals ability to get employment
- Children being bullied
- Access to dentists and dental coverage

Behaviors (smoking, alcoholism, drug use)




## Mentally Unhealthy Days



  - I out of I0 are unemployed and I/3 are below the poverty level


